

The Clan Lindsay Society was saddened to share the death in 2023 of our Chief, Robert A. Lindsay, 29th Earl of Crawford & 12th Earl of Balcarres KT, GCVO, PC [pictured left]. Lord Crawford's memorial service was held on the 26th July at St. Salvator's Chapel, St. Andrews.

Our new Chief, the 30th Earl of Crawford and 13th Earl of Balcarres, is Anthony Robert Lindsay [pictured right].

One of Lord Crawford's first official duties was to act as Deputy to the Great Steward of Scotland at the coronation of King Charles III and Queen Camilla.

In May, Society members met for a cruise on Loch Katrine, following lunch at the pier cafe. The weather was gorgeous and the water calm, with stunning views enjoyed along the waterway. We were unfortunate not to be able to sail on Steamship *Sir Walter Scott* due to ongoing repairs and renovations, but the *Lady of the Lake* was a perfect replacement.



Our annual Gathering was held in September at Falkland Palace, Fife with our base and meeting point at the Victoria Hotel in Kirkcaldy. Lord Crawford, was present to welcome the well attended Gathering and to give an introductory talk before lunch as our new Clan Chief.
